

BCATC SPECIALTY SHOW 2014

The club's annual Specialty show was held **Sunday, April 20**, in conjunction with the Eukanuba Cluster Shows (which include the Auld Lang Syne and Renaissance all-breed shows April 16-21) at Heritage Park in Chilliwack. **Chris Levy**, a Min. Schnauzer breeder judge, from Salem, Oregon judged all breeds and the Group. The Puppy & Juvenile Sweeps judge was **Raymond Yurick**. The entry was 49 terriers (up slightly from 45 last year) with 6 in Sweeps. The All-Terrier Obedience Trial was held on April 18 with 6 entries, and the judge was **Marion Postgate**. Junior handling was also held.

SHOW WINS

He attained his Grand Championship status in both Canada and the United States, as well as being awarded Best In Show on 2 separate occasions. He was #1 Border Terrier In Canada for 2013. He will be shown on a limited basis in 2014. In his only weekend out in Canada so far this year he took 3 Group Firsts and a Group 4th. We are proud of this little homebred boy of ours!



Barbara Watt reports that the Wire Fox she bred, **Ch. Plawsworth Foxburrow Gold Rush,** received an invitation to the Westminster Kennel Club show in February and went Best of Winners! Since then, "Jojo" has finished his US championship, achieving a total of four majors along the way. He is owned by Ann & Louis Gold (Foxburrow), bred by Barbara Watt and Janet MacKenzie, and shown by Will Alexander. Jojo ended 2013 as #2 Wire Fox.



Kelly Greir reports that her 4 month old male Border Terrier puppy **Mysticgold's Lone Ranger** (aka Rebel) won 2 BBPIS at the Victoria City Show in March. She also finished the Canadian Championship on her Westie bitch **Ch. Mysticgold's Dancin' Diva** (aka Dee Dee) on the first day of the Victoria City Show.



And to show that our terriers excel in the entertainment field as well as the show ring, Erin Moore reports that her Norwich, **Ch. Castanewf's Paint the Town Red**, aka Parker, was recently selected for the role of Toto in the Langley Fundamental High School production of the Wizard of Oz. Parker quickly became a favourite with students, cast and crew. He delighted the audience with his comical expressions and obvious affection for "Dorothy". There has been a noticeable reduction in the number of local shows in BC this spring, and so the first set were the Mt. Cheam shows on Feb. 21-23 in Chilliwack. The first day, Ed MacDonald was the substitute judge and he gave the Group to Larisa Hotchin's Welsh, **GCh. Darwyn's Special Blend**. Rick Fehler the next day placed the Welsh Group 3rd, and Sunday, Fabian Daza also gave the group to the Welsh, with Group 4th going to Janis Trotzuk's Scottie, **Ch. Trotters Man In Black**, and Best Puppy to Heather and David Lindberg's **MacBrechin's Evening Skye**.

At the Vic City shows Feb. 28, March 1-2, Nancy Popovich gave the group to the Welsh, **GCh. Darwyn's Special Blend**, Group 2nd to Jackie Marriott's Scottie, **Dunsmuir's Midnight Sorcerer**, and Group 4th to Caren Holtby's Australian **Ch. Tidewalker's Diamond Glory**, and Best Baby Puppy (and later BBPIS) to Kelly Weir's Border, **Mysticgold's Lone Ranger**. The next day, Wendy Maisey also gave the group to the Welsh, followed by Group 3rd to the Scottie, Best Baby Puppy to the Border, and Best Bred By Exhibitor in Group to Jackie Marriott's Scottie, **Dunsmuir Midnight Dream Lover**. On Sunday, Barbara Watt also awarded the Group to the Welsh, Group 3rd to the Scottie, and Best Baby Puppy (and BBPIS) to the Border.

Next up were the Oceanside K.C. shows on March 28-30. On Friday, Serge Tassan gave Group 3rd to John & Penny Rogers' Wheaten, **Ch. Cashel's Oban On Ice**, and Group 4th to Janis Trotzuk's Scottie, **Ch. Trotters Man In Black.** On Saturday, Glen Stark gave the Wheaten Group 2nd, with Group 4th going to Larisa Hotchin's Welsh, **GCh. Darwyn's Special Blend.** On Sunday, Kim Ramey-Leblanc gave the Welsh Group 3rd, and the Wheaten Group 4th.

On the Easter weekend, the scarcity of shows was compensated by a 6-day extravaganza as a result of a co-ordination of two clubs, Auld Lang Syne and Renaissance at Chilliwack, which included the two Terrier Specialties and Min. Schnauzer Specialty reported elsewhere in the newsletter. The first day, Pamela Bruce gave Group 3rd to Larisa Hotchin's Welsh, **GCh. Darwyn's Special Blend**, and Group 4th to John & Penny Rogers' Wheaten, **Ch. Cashel's Oban On Ice**. The second day, Sylvia Barkey placed the Welsh Group 2nd, as did Dr. Robert Smith the third day. The fourth day, Mrs. Polly Smith placed the Welsh Group 3rd, and gave Best Puppy to the Welsh, **Darwyn's Secret Formula**. On day 5, Group 3rd under Linda Kraft also went to the Welsh.



New Arrivals:

A healthy litter of 5 puppy girls was born at Darwyn Welsh Terriers at the end of 2014, out of the bitch imported from Hungary, this girl's sire was bred by the well-known Mr. Peter Green and her grandsire was a very famous dog and top producer shown in the early '80s.

A Japanese Ch bitch is arriving in Canada soon to repeat a breeding to "Joe" – MBIS Am/Can GCh Darwyn's I'm Not Arguing That. We might get this girl into the Canadian show rings, but it depends on what state her jacket and furnishings are in, given that it takes many months to condition the terriers for the show ring.

A bitch bred by Larisa and co-owned with her, who finished in the US all owner-handled, had 6 puppies born in April! Unfortunately one month too late for puppy sweeps at Montgomery – darn!

A dog bred by Larisa and co-owned with her (brother to Larisa's specials dog "Java"), living in Germany, has sired a few litters of which one litter in Serbia has 3 bitches and 1 dog in show homes – the ironic thing is that one show home is in the US! The new owner wanted one from me, but I didn't have one available but recommended this bitch. So, he went all of the way to Serbia to get a bitch from my lines! When Peter and Andrew Green saw this 9 month old bitch, an offer was made to buy her from the new owner! Another top breeder in Europe recently bred to this dog and is very excited about the potential ...we all have our fingers and toes crossed!

New Champions:

New US Grand Ch. **Darwyn Here for a Good Time**. Darwyn's 2.5 year old dog "Trooper", a Joe son, finished his US Grand Championship in top style on the May 1st weekend at the Garden State All Terrier / Bucks County Terrier weekend in Pennsylvania Going into this weekend Trooper had been picking up GCh points each weekend shown against breed competition – mostly with BOS wins since he is being shown in the same area as the US #2 Terrier (and #7 all-breed dog – Jennie, a MBIS winner). At the first day of the Bucks County weekend at Garden State All Terrier Trooper, who only needed 2 singles to finish the GCh, picked up much more than that with the prestigious BOB win over 3 top (and beautiful!) specials, including that top Welsh "Jennie"! Each special shown could have been deserving that day, so we are very very proud of this achievement and top award (as memorable as many of Joe's many BIS wins). Trooper is conditioned and presented by Ernesto Lara and his team.

Show News:

Monty (GCh Am/Can Darwyn Bruhil's Flying Circus), shown by Doug Belter has been shown on a limited basis in the US and 1 weekend in Canada. In the US he is currently the #4 Welsh Terrier and in Canada is #2 Welsh Terrier. In the US during the first 4 months, he has been awarded 2 Group 1st wins, 3 Group 2nd wins; 4 Group 3rd wins and many BOB wins over specials with other terrier specialist handlers. He is certainly helping wave the flag for Canada. In Canada, during the 1 weekend shown, he won or placed in the group each time shown.

Java (Am. Ch./Can GCh. Darwyn's Special Blend) shown mostly by Larisa (breeder/owner) or presented in the ring by Michelle Yeadon, continues to be Canada's #1 Welsh Terrier and one of Canada's top terriers for 2014. In the US, Java was awarded BOB during the Rose City Classic shows in January over a top Welsh Terrier special from California with a handler. Following this win, Java, again handled by Larisa, was awarded multiple Group 1st wins over great terrier competition. During 2014, Java has 5 Group 1st wins and 8 other group placements. His ranking will likely drop as he might move to the US, or take a break over the summer.

Indie (**Darwyn's Miss Independent**) shown mostly by her co-owner from Alberta (someone new to conformation that also actively participates in Agility and Rall-O), was shown at a few competitive shows in the US and is very excited about being so close to her US championship – 9 points with 1 major! Now the challenge will be to find the points available to compete for the rest. Indie's sire is the male with Ernesto Lara that finished his US GCh at Bucks County weekend.

Coca (Darwyn's Secret Formula) came out to the Renaissance Weekend of shows as a puppy and was awarded Best Puppy in Group by judge Mrs. Polly Smith – a Welsh Terrier breeder judge! Polly and her husband Dr. Robert Smith are very familiar with the breed, both placed "Java" in the group ribbons, both were very publically positive about the quality entry they received of all 3 welsh terriers entered. In addition, Coca was awarded Best in Sweeps at the Terrier Breeders Association of Canada Specialty.

Parker (MBIS Am/Can/Australian Ch. Darwyn's Webslinger) was shown by his co-owner at Australia's Spring Fair – Sydney Royal. There were 5 entries for the breed (large for Australia) and under US judge, Ms. Linda More, Parker was awarded BOB! This is essentially Parker's retirement show. He might be shown a couple of times more, but not much. His main job is to hang out in the couch and keep the garden free of vermin!

Terriers are strong in numbers and quality in Japan!

Larisa Hotchin's adventure at Japan's largest Dog Show – 2014



At the end of March 2014, I visited Japan for the first time, and attended the largest dog show held in during the year there with 3000 dogs. This show "FCI: Asia-Pacific" travels to different countries in the region each year and the BIS winner of this show got an all-expenses paid trip to go to the World Challenge associated with the AKC National / Eukanuba, held in Florida in Dec/14. I went because a Japanese breeder/handler visited Canada during summer 2013, bred to my top dog "Joe" and wanted me to see the 6 month old puppies (all 5 are kept as show dogs by himself and his clients) I loved the puppies *so* much that the dam of this litter is moving to Canada to be bred again to Joe.

I was a spectator, and helped be an exhibitor at this two-day show, showing some Welsh and Lakeland Terriers. It was a wonderful experience! My biggest regret is that I did not take enough YEN cash! I expected to be able to use my VISA card. This was a BIG mistake. The huge number of show vendors were cash only. The vast majority of the shops and restaurants that I attended in the following 3 days of sightseeing in the country (including Kyoto) were cash only. US cash was also not accepted. My only savings grace was that I had incredibly generous hosts.

There were just under 250 terriers – about 7.5% of the total show. However, many terrier breeds were represented, with good quality in general and well presented – both trimming and presentation. The judging panel was a mixture from around the world with terriers being judged by Ms. Peggy Beisel-Mcilwaine from the US. The largest terrier entries came from Yorkshires (yes, they are in the terrier group in FCI countries), Norfolk (more than Norwich – which is very different than N. America) and Jack Russells (known as Russells in the US). In addition, there were about 70 Miniature Schnauzers, but they were shown in the working group. Here are the totals.

The show facilities reminded me of a large convention centre, like our past Tradex shows (but bigger), with indoor grooming, power, and organized rings. While it was a two day show, it was only one show. My biggest observations were:

- Puppies (any dog younger than 12 months of age) never compete against adults for winners points or even the chance at BOB
- Males never compete against females, until the very end when the Best in Show Male (King) competes against the Best in Show Female (Queen) for the overall Best in Show!
- Every puppy group and every BOB group is done twice, once for males and once for females (i.e. Best Puppy in Group males, 1 through 4 and then Best Puppy in Group females, 1 through 4).
- Many other competitions, in addition to conformation, occur in the same building, in many cases in rings close by or next to the conformation rings including Agility, Obedience, Grooming, Handling competitions, etc.
- In addition to a junior handling competition there was a general Handling Competition where people of all ages (mostly adults) competed, including professional handlers with the overall winner receiving an expenses paid trip to Westminster 2015!!!! This was a very well attended (and watched) competition! Perhaps something we could do in Canada?
- The catalogue, while mostly in Japanese, is easy for me to read as all of the breed names, dog names, owner names, breeder names and sire/dam names and DOBs are in English. Yeah!

Overall, I loved my experience in Japan. I won't discuss the sightseeing, but I LOVED that and hope to go back one day. I visited 2 kennels while I was there, one being the breeder / handler kennel and one of an All-Breed Judge's kennel. I enjoyed talking "dogs" with my friends, and new friends, there. While a lot is different there, so much is similar to what we experience here. It is very competitive, but I find that dogs were in lovely condition, well cared for and the owners that I got to meet that participate with a handler, lovely and love their dogs as they would children. In fact, I have never seen so many dogs in baby stroller or dressed up in clothes, or dog clothes (that look like kids clothes) as much as I saw it there in Japan.

A truly wonderful experience. Friends and partnerships that I have had for many years now, I look forward to many more years in the future, and I look forward to my next trip to Japan – which will definitely include another dog show! Perhaps a terrier specialty next – 2 weeks after I left there was a terrier specialty in Japan, and 42 Welsh Terriers entered! Just imagine what the other entries would have been like! I don't think we have that many Welsh Terriers in Canada in total in show coat.


