Terrier Breeders will also hold a terrier specialty, so along with the 6 all-breed shows, it's a record eight-point weekend!

SHOW WINS

Debbie Miyashita reports that **Fernrigg's Foxtrot** (Piper) got her first points and first major at Skaha AND took Best Puppy in Group one day.



At the Fraser Valley Dog Fanciers shows Larisa Hotchin's Welsh, Maria (Ch. Darwyn's Santa Maria) went Best in Sweeps, along with other wins reported earlier.



In mid November at the Philadelphia Kennel Club shows, Larisa report that two of her Welsh got majors; Trooper was Winners Dog and sister Tina was Winners and Best of Winners. Both are Joe offspring. Names are **Darwyn Here for a Good Time** and **Darwyn's Tina Bossypants**. They are being conditioned and handled by Ernesto Lara.

At the Alberni Valley Shows, Oct. 16-18, Douglas and Avery Gaudin, along with Russel Fletcher, judged terriers. Jackie Marriott's Scottie, **Ch. Glenby's Midnight Journey**, went Group 2nd under all three judges, and Ken & Elaine Allen's Min. Schnauzer **Ch. Dreamaker High Flyer** also went Group 4th under Douglas Gaudin and Group 3rd under Fletcher. Jackie Marriott's puppy, **Dunsmuir's Midnight Sorcerer**, went Puppy Group under Fletcher.

The Lower Mainland Dog Fanciers shows this year moved to their new location in Abbotsford and were a much lower-key affair, with entries down to about half of what they've been at the Tradex in previous years. Two more crowded buildings were used, but the rings still had red curtains and the judges were mostly international. However, without the leading Westie and Kerry Blue present, the terrier group (with 38-47 dogs) opened up to another tier of terriers, a different one winning the group each day. The first day under US judge Dennis McCoy, the group was won by Ken & Elaine Allen's Min. Schnauzer Ch. Dreamaker High Flyer (who was also best owner handled), followed by Larisa Hotchin's Welsh, GCh. Darwyn's Special Blend, with John & Penny Rogers' Wheaten Ch. Cashel's Oban On Ice picking up Group 4th. The Wheaten moved up to Group 3rd the second day under Randy Garren, and then won the Group (and Best Bred By and Reserve Best on Show) on Saturday under Rowbotham, and the Dandie Dinmont, Ch. King's Mtn Alice Springs, shown by Cassidy Furlong, went Group 4th. The last day, another Swedish judge, Johan Juslin, took a class Scottie owned by Graeme & Janice Ramsden to Group 1st, followed by the Min. Schnauzer in 2nd and the Welsh in 4th, with the Wheaten going Best Bred By Exhibitor.



At the Elsie Murray Canine Centre shows Nov. 22-24 in Cloverdale, the Westie won the group each day, with the Welsh **GCh. Darwyn's Special Blend** going Group 2nd under Robert Verhulst (replacing the recently deceased long-time judge Skip Stanbridge), and the Min. Schnauzer **Ch. Dreamaker High Flyer** going Group 3rd, and Heather and David Lindberg's new Scottie puppy, **Macbrechin's Evening Skye** taking best puppy. Under the local terrier breeder judge Brent Wright, the Welsh went Group 3rd and the Min. Schnauzer Group 4th. The last day under Shirley Limoges, the Welsh went Group 3rd, with the Wheaten **Ch. Cashel's Oban On Ice** picking up Group 4th.

Barbara Watt reports that **Ch. Plawsworth Foxburrow Gold Rush**, a puppy I bred and sold to the Foxburrow Kennel in Ontario, was not shown until September, at 10 months of age. During his short puppy career at shows in Ontario and Quebec, he achieved a Best Puppy in Show at United Kennel Club in Montreal, a total of 11 Best Puppy in Group, and numerous group placings including three Group 1st. "Jojo" is by Eng/Am/Can Ch. Travella Solid Gold x my Can/AmCh. Plawsworth Belle of Bon Accord, and is the last puppy to be shown from his illustrious sire who is now retired from stud. Moving on to the US, while still a puppy, Jojo was awarded Winners Dog for a 5-point major at Hatboro, followed by RWD at Montgomery County under judge Andrew Goodsell. Needless to say, as his breeder, I am thrilled with his accomplishments!



At the Ottawa K.C. shows in November, Ken & Elaine Allen's Min. Schnauzer Am Ch. & GCh. Dreamaker High Flyer went Group 2nd under Dr Francisco Chapa Guajardo and Group 3rd under Jim Reynolds. Ace is currently ranked #1 Min. Schnauzer in Canada by Canuckdogs, finishing a great show year accumulating numerous group placements. His most recent wins being at LMDF, Ottawa Kennel Club and Elsie Murray shows. Ken & Elaine say: Thank you to all the judges that have awarded this outstanding dog. He really is our "High Flyer" and we couldn't be prouder!
