

BCATC SPECIALTY SHOW 2013

The club will hold a Specialty show **Sunday**, **May 12**, in conjunction with the Tyee Kennel Club shows in Duncan indoors at the Cowichan Exhibition Grounds. Noted Border Terrier breeder **Michael Shoreman** from Ontario will judge all breeds and the Group. The Puppy, Juvenile and Veteran Sweeps judge will be **Dawne Deeley**. The Junior Handling judge is **Jill Scholl**. Tyee has scheduled other terrier breeder judges (Katelon Bajona-Fox, Rosemary Shoreman and Brent Wright) for their all-breed shows, so it's a four-point weekend!

Baby Puppy and Veteran classes are offered, as well as the separate Bred-By-Exhibitor unofficial class with an additional \$10. fee. There are also supported entries for the following breeds: Border Terriers (Debbie Miyashita), Kerry Blue (Anita Norman and Kelly Nordman); Min. Schnauzers (Vicki Stephens).

Prizes and rosettes will be awarded to the Group placing winners (including Best Puppy and Best Veteran) and a rosette to the breed-level winners (Best of Breed, Best of Opposite, Best of Winners, Best Puppy, Award of Merit) with an additional prize given to all Best of Breed winners. Club members whose dogs place in the group will receive an additional cash bonus (\$25 for Group 1-4, \$20 for Best Puppy).

The show chair is Janis Trotzuk, and the show secretary is Western Dog Shows (westerndogshows.com) whose webpage contains complete information. **Deadline: April 24.**

Trophy donations should go to BCATC, Janis Trotzuk, 20072 – 49A Avenue, Langley, B.C. V3A 3S1. There will be only a limited number of catalogues printed, so **pre-orders are strongly encouraged** (prices are \$6 pre-ordered and \$10. at the show).

NEW CHAMPIONS & TITLEHOLDERS

Lori Little reports that Easter weekend her wheaten Scottie, **Trotter's Hot Toddy Cgn RN CD** ("Morgan") earned her obedience CD title, then moved up to Open and earned her first CDX leg.



Trotters Man In Black (aka "Cole"), a Scottie owned by Janis Trotzuk, started his show career at the Oceanside Show in March by going Best of Winners, 2 days of 4, as well as Best Puppy in Group. Sired by Am/Can Ch. Bookmaker De Champernoune (Bennie), owned by Vandra Huber, Greg and Terry Brown, and Janis Trotzuk's dam, Can/Am Ch. McVan's Wildfire At Trotters (Pepper). During the recent Renaissance Dog Club shows, Cole attained his championship by earning two Best of Winners placements, along with two Best Puppy in Breed, at the age of 9 and half months. All wins were from the puppy classes, where he was the youngest dog in the classes and the only male puppy. At the Terrier Breeders Association Of Canada Specialty, Cole also earned a Best Of Winners placement and Best Puppy In Breed. These wins earned him his Canadian Championship, and the beginning of his show career as a Special.

SHOW WINS

Bruce Fraser reports that his black female Min. Schnauzer, **Ch. Advocate Empire Over the Top**, "Kylie", owned by him and co-bred with club member Vicki Stephens, took a 5-point major at the Portland Terrier Specialty weekend. There were 15 bitches in the ring (12 is the level for 5 points). These are Kylie's first American points.



Greg & Vicki Stephens enjoyed some nice wins at the January circuit in Puyallup, WA & Portland, OR. First was **Ch. Empire's Dancing Til Dawn** (Dana), earning her first US points, a 4-point major from the 12-18 month class. Thanks to Judge Ms. Nancy Smith Hafner for this wonderful win. Not to be outdone, **Ch. Empire's Vanilla Bean** was Winners Bitch/Best of Winners at the Tualatin K.C. at Portland shows for her 3rd major, a 5-point win. Thanks to judge Mr. Robert Paust for this awesome win.

Also at the Puyallup shows, Barry Truax's male Scottie **Ch. Glenfraser's Alexander of Gallica** picked up a 4-point major against all professional handlers under judge Gloria Geringer.



The BC show year began as usual with the Ladies K.C. shows Jan. 25-27, and it brought together many newer dogs in the group ring, with only the Westie and Aussie shown by David & Pat Gignac repeating from last year. Terriers were judged by Jack Ireland, Tom Alexander and Harold Pybus. Larisa Hotchin's Welsh, **Darwyn's Special Blend** went Group 3rd under Ireland and Pybus, and the Dandie Dinmont, **Ch. King's Mtn Alice Springs**, shown by Cassidy Furlong went Group 4th under Alexander.

Am GCh Can Ch Minuteman Safety Last Cgn won Best of Breed at Westminster Kennel Club over some of America's top mini's! Owner handled all the way by Krystal Mason, bred and co-owned by Catherine McMillan. This is after achieving #1 Min. Schnauzer and #5 Terrier in Canada in 2012.




Arguably, the hottest new Terrier in Canada is a Kerry Blue Terrier, **Saredon Shock Waves of Irisblu**, imported from Ireland by Anita Norman, and co-owned with breeder Harold Quigg. "Lexi" has been burning up the show ring both sides of the border, handled by Anita's daughter Deena Simon, starting with two strong group placements in Washington state plus other group wins such that she is now ranked #3 Kerry Blue in the U.S. under the all-breed system. In Canada, her individual wins are listed in the shows below, but these include two all-breed BIS plus a BISS to date, which places her as #2 Terrier with about 900 points. She regularly turns heads at every show where she appears, given her superb outline and movement, but Anita says she's also great to live with, given her outgoing personality. The candid photo below says a lot about her personality, particularly given the wagging tail.



The Lower Mainland spring shows were held Feb. 15-17 at their new location in Abbotsford. Under Kristen Francis, Jackie Marriott's new Scottie male, **Ch. Glenby's Midnight Journey**, went Group 3rd with Ken & Elaine Allen's Min. Schnauzer, **Ch. Dreamaker High Flyer**, taking Group 4th. On Saturday, club member Barbara Watt placed the Schnauzer Group 2nd and the Scottie Group 3rd, a call that was repeated on Sunday with Michel Bouchard.

The Mount Cheam shows in Chilliwack were held Feb. 22-24. On Friday, Lynda Berar's group choices represented nearly a club sweep of the Group placements. Group 1^{st} went to Ken & Elaine Allen's Min. Schnauzer, **Ch. Dreamaker High Flyer**, Group 2^{nd} and Best Puppy to Larisa Hotchin's Welsh, **Darwyn's Special Blend**, Group 3^{rd} to Judy Hodgkin's S.C. Wheaten, **Hion Allegria.** The Welsh also went Best Puppy in Show under Berar. The Min. Schnauzer also won the Group under Edgar Bajona on Saturday, with the Welsh taking Best Puppy. On Sunday, Dianne Miller placed the Min. Schnauzer Group 3^{rd} , and the Wheaten Group 4^{th} .



At the Vic City shows, March 1-3, Lyn Norman gave Group 1st to Jackie Marriott's Scottie, **Ch. Glenby's Midnight Journey** (who went on to Reserve BIS), Group 2nd to Barbara Watt's Wire Fox, **Plawsworth Reprise** (co-owned with Patricia Laugharne), Group 3rd to Anita Norman's Kerry Blue, **Saredon Shock Waves of Irisblu**, and Group 4th to Kelly Grier's Westie, **Ch. Mysticgold's Power Play.** The Scottie also won the group and went RBIS under Ole Nielsen, with the Kerry taking Group 2nd and Ken & Elaine Allen's Min. Schnauzer, **Ch. Dreamaker High Flyer**, taking Group 3rd and Joanne Helm's Irish, **Takala's Kelly Green**, going Group 4th (see photo below). The big event of the weekend was the final day when Anita Norman's Kerry, **Saredon Shock Waves of Irisblu**, went Best on Show from the classes under Australian judge Mary Gillan Cronchey! The Group judge was Ed MacDonald, who placed the Schnauzer Group 2nd, and the Wire Group 4th.



Joanne Helm also reports that they just returned from NorCal and at the Irish Terrier Specialty Kelly was Winners dog and Best of Winners handled by Mary Carr to judge Ed Bivin. Today he got a three point major and went Winner's dog, Best of Winners and Best of Opposite under judge Clay Cody. Ch. Indus George of Victoria (Airedale terrier bred by Joanne Helm and owned by Mary Carr) got a 4 point major at NorCal and went Winner's dog and Best of Winners. A successful trip.

A revived Oceanside K.C. held 4 shows on Easter weekend also at the Abbotsford Rec Centre. The first day, Janet Buchanan placed the Kerry Blue **Saredon Shock Waves of Irisblu** Group 2nd, with Larisa Hotchin's Welsh, **Darwyn's Special Blend, Group 3rd**, and Best Puppy to Janis Trotzuk's Scottie, **Trotters Man In Black.** On Saturday, Harold Hutchinson gave Group 4th to Ken & Elaine Allen's Min. Schnauzer, **Ch. Dreamaker High Flyer**, and Best Puppy and Best Bred By Exhibitor to two young and very cute Norwich, owned by Heather Tomlins, namely **Amblegreen Zigzag Mystic Mojo** and **Amblegreen Tutti Frutti**, respectively. On Sunday, Ray Smith placed the Kerry Group 2nd, and the Border Terrier, **Ch. Otter Echo Little Marvel**, owned by Krystal Kenna and Lori Nobes Group 4th. On Monday, terrier breeder judge Dianne Ivey placed the Min. Schnauzer Group 2nd, and gave Best Bred By to Nancy Halford's Am. Staffordshire, **Ch. Marauder's Ruger Vaquero**.

Renaissance K.C. held 4 shows April 12-15 at Chilliwack. Anita Norman's Kerry Blue Terrier, **Saredon Shock Waves of Irisblu**, had a great weekend, going Group 2nd under Paula Hartinger, winning the Terrier Breeder's Specialty under Bull Terrier breeder judge Lynne Myall (see full results below), and winning the Group and going Best in Show under Roger Hartinger. Hartinger also placed the Dandie Dinmont, **Ch. King's Mtn Alice Springs**, shown by Cassidy Furlong, Group 4th. News at **Darwyn Welsh Terrier** (Larisa Hotchin): During the first quarter of 2013, Darwyn Welsh Terriers have been very active in the show rings around the world!

In Australia:

Parker (Am/Can/Aus Ch. Darwyn's Webslinger) was shown 4 weekends during the first quarter (too hot to show more!). In those 4 weekends, he was awarded 3 Group 1st wins, a Runner Up Best in Show and an All-Breed Best in Show! Parker is always owner handled by Sonya who co-owns him with Larisa Hotchin (his breeder). One of the Group 1st wins was awarded by Mr. Kerry Lee - a well-known Kerry Blue and Wire Fox Terrier breeder (who also judged the Terrier Group one day on Montgomery weekend 2012); Parker's BIS award was from an Airedale Terrier breeder. Getting top awards, owner-handled, by well-respected Terrier Breeder judges has been very exciting!

In Germany:

MJ (**Darwyn's Mighty Joe Young** - a Joe and Dora son) was shown once, won his junior class and was awarded a V1 (Excellent 1) and a CAC (which is a championship certificate). The judge is a well-known Miniature Bull Terrier Breeder wrote this critique about this one year old dog (translated): "strong male dog, good typical head, correct ears, correct forehand, enough angled hindquarters, correct tail, excellent hair quality and color distribution, excellent temperament, correct parallel movement".

In Canada:

Java (Welsh Terrier **Ch. Darwyn's Special Blend** - MJ's brother) finished his championship with two group 3rd and a group 2nd placement and a Best Puppy in Show! He is currently the #1 Welsh Terrier in Canada. Also, a Welsh Terrier breeder in Ontario had a litter of 6 healthy puppies in March, sired by GCh Am/Can Darwyn Bruhil's Flying Circus (Monty). And, early this year, we received the final results from 2012, with Joe staying in the Top 10 dogs among all-breeds for the 2nd year in a row - **MBIS GCh Am/Can Ch. Darwyn's I'm Not Arguing That**!

In the US:

* Emme (Am.GCh Darwyn Esmeralda in Sanherpinc) received multiple group wins, a Reserve Best in Show, and an All-Breed Best in Show! This follows 2 BOB wins on Montgomery 2012 weekend (Hatboro I & II). Emme is now retired from the show ring and is hopefully expecting puppies.

* Java (Can Ch. Darwyn's Special Blend) received 2 majors from the bred-by class in Portland and then was pulled from competition so that he could compete in the classes at the National Specialty weekend in Arizona. At that show, again owner-handled, Java was RWD 3 days that weekend (2 by breeder judges), when there were 5 point majors awarded -- WD went to 3 and 4 year old dogs with professional handlers. We were thrilled with this result, even more thrilled with comments from our peers about this special Joe and Dora son.
