BCATC SPECIALTY SHOW 2012

The club's annual Specialty show will be held **Thursday, October 25**, in conjunction with Canada's largest show, Lower Mainland Dog Fanciers at the Tradex in Abbotsford. **David Kirkland** from North Carolina will judge all breeds and the Group. The Puppy & Juvenile Sweeps judge will be club life member **Anita Norman**. The Obedience Specialty judge is **Bruce Fraser**. The National Specialty for Cairn Terriers and one for all Bull breeds (sponsored by the Staffordshire Bull Terrier Club of Canada) will also be held, along with several breed-sponsored prizes. Lower Mainland has scheduled an all-breed show the same day, so it's a five-point weekend!

Prizes and rosettes will be awarded to the Group placing winners and top four Breed winners (BB, BOS, BW, BP). The popular junior handling competition will be held before the Group judged by **Krista Cadioux**. The club will participate each day in the "Meet the Breed" booth that is popular with the public. The winning photographs will feature a strong combination of the assets we seek in an image. These include: thoughtful attention to lighting, eye-catching colour; balanced composition; sharpness; correct exposure; and other elements.

1. Composition – “rule of thirds” – is the photo balanced?
2. Focus (sharpness) – the picture, above all, needs to be in focus (or, if the picture features some blurriness, it has to be a clearly intentional, artistic use of blur by the photographer).
3. Exposure & colour - pleasing colours with clarity and correct exposure
4. Creativity/artistry - Does the photographer show an artistic eye? Do they seem to notice the unique and the unusual and make the most of it? Did the photographer use creative techniques to make an interesting effect?

Photos will be judged by a panel of 3 members of the Shuswap Photo Arts photography club, who will not necessarily know terriers or even dogs so photos will be chosen on their artistic merit, rather than their representation of conformity to breed standard. Placings will be awarded 1st to 4th in each category and winners will receive ribbons. 1st place will also get a prize in addition to the ribbon. NOTE: All photos submitted will be deemed as coming without copyright unless *specified*. Winning photos will therefore be published in the newsletter and on the website and other photos submitted may be as well, depending on space availability. Other use of the photographs on approval only!

A couple of hints! 1) no borders on the photos – crop them out and 2) hide your signatures or copyrights so they don't detract from the pictures (if applicable). Our judges are dedicated to three things:

- Judging images exclusively on quality rather than on the name, skill, or equipment of the photographer.
- Being open to all kinds of excellence, and
- Refraining from photo snobbery.

Now do send in your pictures! and have fun taking them!

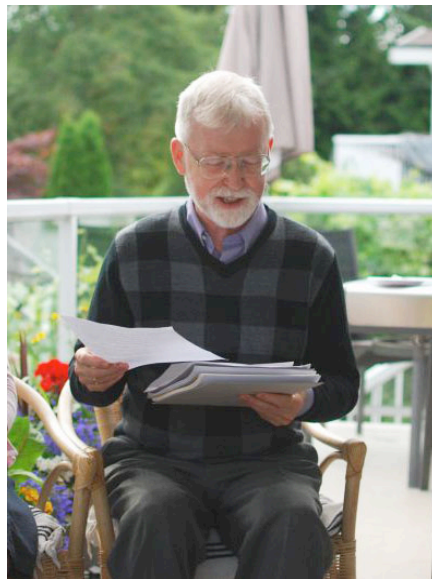

NEW BCATC LIFE MEMBER

The following bio is submitted by our new Life Member:

Barry Truax

30 years ago in 1982, I seemed to be the least likely person to become a terrier fancier; it was my partner Guenther Krueger who wanted “a Scottie”. I knew nothing about dogs or Scotties, least of all grooming and showing, but we got our first Scottie, Bailey, and were hooked; the dog was from a pet breeder, but the sire was an English import, owned by Sally Bremner, and the grandsire was the famous British dog Eng. Ch. Mayson Monopoly.

I started learning to groom and show in 1983 (with a lot of help and grooming seminars with Bergit Coady and Ric Chasoudian) and 3 years later Bailey was a Canadian and American champion, #5 in Canada, with a career total of 17 group placements. By then people stopped giving grooming advice and starting asking for it! A lot was learned along the way.

Getting a breeding foundation was even harder, and eventually we got two bitches, one from Ann Bower of the Barraglen kennel in Oregon, the other from Betty Shatford in Nova Scotia, a double Perlor Playboy granddaughter. Our first Glenfraser litter didn't arrive until 1990, and today we are breeding our 6th generation of Scotties, with 28 Canadian and 8 American champions to our credit, and others pointed. We haven't had a “top dog” in terms of a BIS or BISS dog, but our dogs have placed 7 times in the top 5 of the breed nationally, and 11 more in the top 10; there have also been 6 Best Puppy in Show wins, and collectively over 200 group placements. Our top-winning dog has been Can/Am Ch. Glenfraser's Lochinvar Lad (Toby) who was 3 times in the top 5, and garnered 74 Group placements with over 1500 points. Another dog, Can/Am Ch. Glenfraser's Morgan Devil (Oban), was the BCATC Top Terrier in 2005. There are lots of details and photos on our website: www.sfu.ca/~truax/glenfras.html

In many ways, I regard the experiences with our wonderful co-owners – 17 so far – as being the best part of the breeding program, as all have become life-long friends, not to mention how the Scotties have contributed to these people's lives, with 6 of them going on to have litters of their own. Most notable is the foundation bitch Malena who we provided Charlene Gann in Denver in 2002. She has gone on to create the entire Gallica clan, now in its 4th generation with many American champions and earth dog title holders.

Guenther and I joined the BCATC around 1983-84, and in the late 1980s I served as President for one year. I began the *Terrier Times* newsletter in December 1988 which has continued to be a regular feature of the club to this day and I compile the club's annual trophy winners. In 1991 the club gave me an Award of Merit for service to the club.

I started digitally compiling Scottie standings in 1983, then those for all Terriers in 1986, and the next year we were invited to compile the national Top Dog Standings by *Dogs in Canada*; with the help of Guenther, we did this for 20 years, entering over 875,000 Best of Breed wins, not to mention Group placements and BIS wins. I provide the analytical data from that period for all breeds to interested parties and continue to compile terrier data (now 1986 to the present) that I freely share with club members, as well as publishing the current standings in the newsletter.

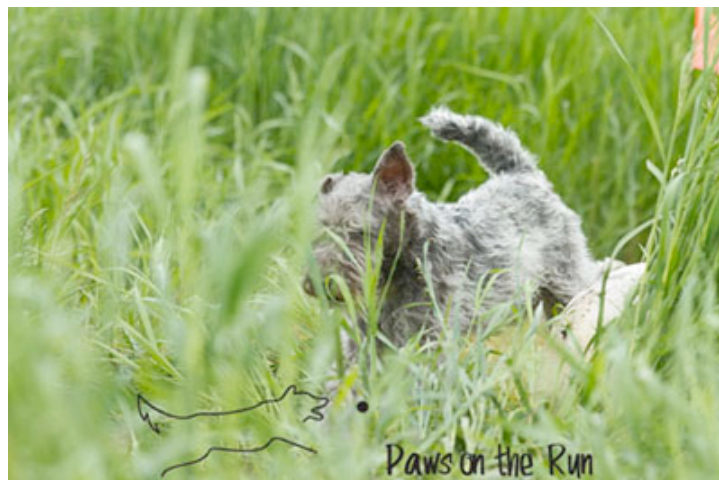

NEW CHAMPIONS & TITLEHOLDERS

2012 has been a good year so far, **BISS Am/Can Ch. Minuteman Safety Last** ("Sprite") made his US debut, defeating the Number 1 Miniature Schnauzer in the US and the Number 1 Miniature Schnauzer in Canada in 2011 from the classes for a 4 point major; he then topped the day off with a Group 3! Sprite completed his American title in just 6 days going BOW or better 5 out of the 6 days finishing with a 5 point major under Michelle Billings. We then attended the American Miniature Schnauzer Club Roving National (in a breed entry up to 80), and Sprite was awarded 1st AOM, and that same weekend Sprite was awarded Select Dog and Best Owner Handled; we are now just 1 point away from our American Grand Championship. Back in Canada, Sprite is a multiple Group winner and recently won the Canadian Miniature Schnauzer National! Sprite is currently ranked #1 Miniature Schnauzer in Canada and is always owner handled both in Canada and the US.



Allyn Power reports that her blue bitch "DD" is now a well-balanced Lakeland as she has added a title behind her name. She is now **Ch. Threfall Tanto Cardinal JE** as she got her second Q in Junior Earthdog at the PEA tests on [June 16, 2012](#). She added a third Q for fun and, in both trials, made it to the quarry in just 10 seconds.



Heather Tomlins reports that **Amblegreen Top Notch** (Kona) is now a new American Champion finishing on **May 28th** at the Coeur d'Alene Dog Fanciers with a 5-point major. The judge was Mr. Richard Lopaschuk. His points all came from the Bred By class and include 3 majors – two from terrier Specialties. Kona is owned/bred and handled by Heather Tomlins.

SHOW WINS

Ch. Glenwell Didgeridoo, bred by Barbara Welch and owned by Florence Yunik, won a 4-point major at the Sealyham Terrier Club of Southern California Specialty Show, **June 22, 2012**. The specialty was held in conjunction with the Great Western Terrier Association. Sally George was the judge and Adrian Ghione was Roo's handler. It was a wonderful trip and great set of shows. The hospitality and venue were terrific. Thank you to Sally George for this major win. Thank you to Adrian Ghione for presenting Roo so well.



The Washington State Scottish Terrier club held its annual Specialty in Puyallup June 8, followed by two all-breed shows. The Specialty winner was Am Ch. McVan's Be Bop Betty, a gorgeous female who has already won BB at Crufts, and recently the Canadian National Specialty and the US Rotating Specialty. At the Specialty, Charlene Gann (of the Gallica kennel in Denver) showed her wheaten puppy who is just

shy of 9 months to Best in Sweepstakes under Shaun Nichols, and Best of Winners for 5 points under breeder judge Tom Hossfeld. This is a great grandson of her foundation bitch, Can/Am Ch. Glenfraser's Black Brenna, bred by Barry Truax who was a proud onlooker. Club member Jackie Marriott's girl, **Dunsmuir Blacksilver Elegance**, went Winners Bitch at the Specialty, showed by her co-breeder Christine Stephens, and Reserve Winners the other two days. Barry's boy Tucker also went reserve winners one day to a 4-point major.

The Comox Valley shows June 9-11 attracted a small terrier entry as usual. Jackie Marriott's Scottie, **Ch. Dunsmuir's Black Ice Treasure**, went Group 2nd under Susan Badick and Group 3rd under David Paterson. Larisa Hotchin's yearling Welsh, **Ch. Darwyn Don Diego de la Vega**, went Group 2nd under Lynn Storeshaw.

The Nanaimo K.C. shows got a bit bigger entry, but with absentees, there were few breeds with class points available. Instead, the current trend for the terrier group ring to be handler dominated was very strong with about 2/3 of the 11-12 breed winners being with pro handlers. Larisa Hotchin's Welsh, **Am GCh & Can Ch. Darwyn's I'm Not Arguing That**, won the group under Michel Doherty and Michael Woods, and went Group 2nd under Lawrence Stanbridge who placed the Scottie, **Ch. Dunsmuir's Black Ice Treasure**, Group 3rd. Joy Viel's young Irish, **Red Branch D'artagnan of the Ring**, went Group 3rd under Doherty.

At the Nicola Valley shows June 30-July 2, the New Zealand import Westie owned by June Fraser and handled by David Gignac won the small terrier group all 3 days, along with the Westie National Specialty, and BIS under both Robert and Elaine Whitney. Bob Whitney placed Nancy Halford's Amstaff, **Ch. Marauders Ruger Vaquero**, Group 2nd. This small show remarkably featured two international judges, Kornelija Butrimova from Lithuania, who gave Group 4th to the Irish, **Red Branch D'artagnan of the Ring**, and Katharina Round from France who judged the Westie Specialty where Kelly Grier's Westie, **Mysticgold's Power Play**, went Best Puppy.

Marlene Furlong reports about her daughter Cassidy's recent show wins: Cassidy is having fun showing her Dandies, **King's Mtn. Alice Springs** in Breed and **Mydan'd Adelaide Raindance** in Juniors. We attended the Chehalis show where she had a first placement in Juniors and BOS in Breed. Cassidy also had a great weekend in Portland. She placed both days in Juniors and took BOS both days in Breed. Cassidy's Aunt Cathi showed her male Simon Sez and took BOB both days. Cassidy took Simon into the Group ring and got her first Group 4th placement. Simon went on to take a Group 3rd placement the second day. Back home, Cassidy showed at the GRCC Specialty and was chosen the 2012 Best Overall Junior. She also showed at the Miniature Dachshund Specialty and was chosen Best Overall Junior. Cassidy is looking forward to the up coming shows in August and a vacation in San Diego.



The Vernon & Dist K.C. shows July 6-8, held in Lavington, were well organized but suffered from extreme heat which is common at this time of year in the Okanagan. The terriers were expected to perform in 35-degree afternoon heat in fairly long grass. Perhaps as a result, there were many absentees, except for the Airedales who had their National Specialty there. Larisa Hotchin's Welsh, **Am GCh & Can Ch. Darwyn's I'm Not Arguing That**, won the group handily all 3 days with Joy Viel's Irish, **Red Branch D'artagnan of the Ring**, going Group 2nd under Linda Berar and Group 4th under Jack Ireland. The Welsh went BIS under Mary White the last day. Thanks to our club secretary, Debbie Miyashita, who set up a tent with cake, fruit and punch at ringside on behalf of the club, all of which was much appreciated in the heat.

The only local show during the summer in the Lower Mainland is the Pacific K.C. show at Hazlemere RV Park, held July 26-29. This 4-day show attracted a large terrier entry of about 35-37 dogs in about 17 breeds, all judged by BC judges. It also reflected the current American-style trend to be handler dominated, including visiting handlers such as Doug Belter with a Wire Fox special, an Airedale special from Alberta, and an American handler with 3 magnificent Skye terriers from Texas, the likes of which we never see here. David Gignac won the group the 3 days he was entered, under Dianne Ivey, Ed Macdonald (filling in for Margaret Jones) and Katelon Bajona-Fox, with the other handlers close behind (Bill Walkey judged the fourth day). Terrier breeder Dianne Ivey's Best Puppy was John & Penny Rogers' Wheaten, **Cashel's Oban On Ice**, who she took to BPIS. Bajona Fox gave Group 4th to Anita Norman's Kerry, **Melbee's Witch's Consort**. It was also good to see club life member and judge, Don Emslie, back in the ring after a long absence with a Schnauzer co-owned with Shannon Taylor in Calgary.

The same weekend, other club members ventured to Prince George for the 6-show weekend with 15 terriers entered. Larisa Hotchin's Welsh, **Am GCh & Can Ch. Darwyn's I'm Not Arguing That**, won the group at all 6 shows and went BIS under Terry Carter, as well as Reserve BIS at two other shows. Jackie Marriott's Scottie, **Ch. Dunsmuir's Black Ice Treasure**, went Group 2nd under Carter, Group 3rd under John Ross and Group 4th under Russel Fletcher. Ken & Elaine Allen's Min. Schnauzer, **Ch. Dreamaker High Flyer** went Group 3rd and Best Puppy under Carter and Larry Kereluke, Group 4th under Fletcher, and Group 2nd under Ross who took it on to BPIS. On Sunday, Fred Dewsbury gave Group 2nd to Vicki Stephens' Min. Schnauzer, **Ch. Empire's Vanilla Bean**, and Best Puppy to the Allen's **Dreamaker Music Of The Night**. Nancy Popovich gave Group 4th to **Ch. Empire's Vanilla Bean** and Best Puppy to **Ch. Dreamaker High Flyer**.

Miniature Schnauzer, **Shantays Your Turn To Pay**, aka Piper, travelled with her co-owners Don Emslie and Tim Doxtater to the July Houston Terrier Club Specialties in Houston Texas and upheld the Annfield tradition. In an entry of 20 class exhibits, Piper twice garnered the Best Of Winners award and twice Reserve Winners Bitch coming home with two 4-point majors. Piper is sired by BIS, BISS Can. & BISS Am. Ch. Annfield Turn Turn Turn and a double granddaughter of BIS, BISS (Can.) & BISS (Am.) Ch. Annfield Oh For Sure who holds the Canadian breed record for winning Best Of Breed at both the Westminster Kennel Club and the Montgomery County American Miniature Schnauzer Club National Specialty shows.

Darwyn Welsh Terriers continues to be busy this spring. Joe - **MBIS / MBISS GCh Am/Can Darwyn's I'm Not Arguing That** - recently was awarded his 126th career group win, his 22nd all-breed Best in Show and 2 more All-Terrier Specialty Group 1st wins this year. At this time he is the #1 Terrier and the #3 dog among all breeds (according to Canuckdogs)! WOW! He is being conditioned and presented by Milton Lopes out of Calgary.
