

BCATC 50TH ANNIVERSARY SPECIALTY SHOW 2015

The club's annual Specialty show was held Saturday, April 4, in conjunction with the Renaissance all-breed shows, at Heritage Park in Chilliwack. **Wyoma Clouss**, a Min. Schnauzer breeder judge, from Idaho judged all breeds and the Group. The Puppy & Juvenile Sweeps judge was **Stella Newby**, a founding member of the club. The entry was 80 terriers (up from 49 last year) with 21 in Sweeps. The Obedience Trial was held on April 3 with 9 entries, and the judge was **Karen Brearly**. Junior handling was also held. Following a long day of showing we headed off to our celebratory dinner. Attendance was excellent with 40 members and guests present. Bruce Fraser chose a lovely golf course venue close to the show site. The food was excellent and considering how tired we all were, the energy of the group was upbeat and very positive. We participated in the Northern California Terrier Association Specialty on the Thursday with Dart taking the BOS, Friday saw us in the Irish Terrier Club of Northern California Specialty under Jon Cole where he was pulled as Best of Breed!!! So thrilled with that! Saturday at the Sacramento All Breed show he was once again BOS and BOH in Breed. We then went onto get a Group 3 in the National Owner Handled Series. Sunday we wrapped up a great weekend with our third BOS. It was a wonderful experience and I was so glad I handled my special boy myself. All the grooming and practice we did in the months ahead definitely paid off. A special thanks goes to Joe & Elena Metz. Without them this would not have happened.



The B.C. show year started only in late February with the Mt Cheam K.C. shows in Chilliwack. With the Whitebriar Westie (last year's top terrier) having returned to New Zealand, the path was open for other local dogs to win some groups. The first day, Dr. Vania Haga awarded the group to Larisa Hotchin's Welsh, Can. Ch. & Am GCh. Darwyn's Bruhil's Flying Circus, with John & Penny Rogers' Wheaten, Ch. Cashel's Oban On Ice, going Group 3rd. The next day, Dr. Haga took the Welsh to Best in Show, following Bruce Fraser giving it the group win, with the Wheaten again going Group 3rd, and Janis Trotzuk's Scottie, GCh. Trotters Man In Black, going Group 4th. The last day, Chan Weng Woh completed the hatrick for the Welsh by awarding it the group, and the Wheaten Group 3rd, with Caren Holtby's Australian, Ch. Tidewalker Diamond Glory, going Group 2nd. Joanne Helm's Airedale, Indus I Wish I Had a Bentley, took Puppy Group.

At the Vic City shows, Feb. 27-28 and Mar. 1, held in Duncan, club member Karsten Kaemling gave John & Penny Rogers' Wheaten, **Ch. Cashel's Oban On Ice**, Group 1st and Reserve Best in Show the first day, with Larisa Hotchin's Welsh, **Can. Ch. & Am GCh. Darwyn's Bruhil's Flying Circus**, going Group 2nd. Best Baby Puppy in Group went to Kelly Greir's Westie, **Mysticgold's Once Upon A Time**. The second day, Sandra Lex gave the group to Janis Trotzuk's Scottie, **GCh. Trotters Man In Black**, and Group 3rd (and Best Bred By Exhibitor) to Caren Holtby's Australian, **Ch. Tidewalker Diamond Glory**, with the Welsh going Group 4th. The last day, Saija Juutilainen gave the Australian Group 2nd, and Sandra Lex took it on to Best Bred by Exhibitor in Show (note: this is a new class that BC Dog Shows is offering – free! – when making an online entry, not to be confused with the regular bred by class or shows where the exhibitor pays for a separate class). The Wheaten also went Group 3rd under the Finnish judge.

At the Oceanside K.S. shows March 27-29 in Cloverdale, Ricardo Torres-Simoes awarded the Group to Anita Norman's new female Kerry Blue, **Irisblu The Harpist**, with the Wheaten, **Ch. Cashel's Oban On Ice**, going Group 2nd and the Welsh, **Ch. Darwyn's Bruhil's Flying Circus**, going Group 3rd. The second day, Dr. Tamas Jakkel gave the Wheaten Group 2nd and Janis Trotzuk's Scottie, **GCh. Trotters Man In Black**, Group 4th. Best Bred By Exhibitor was Joanne Helm's Airedale, **Indus I Wish I Had a Bentley**. On Sunday, Janet Buchanan gave the group to the Scottie, Group 2nd to the Wheaten, and Group 3rd to the Welsh, with the Wheaten being the best owner-handled in the group.

Besides the two Terrier Specialties, there were four all-breed shows at the Renaissance Dog Assoc. shows April 3-6, with larger than normal terrier groups as a result of those Specialties. The first day, the German judge, Hassi Assenmacher-Feyel awarded the group to Larisa Hotchin's Welsh, **Ch. Darwyn's Bruhil's Flying Circus**, and Best Baby Puppy to Debbie Miyashita's Border, **Fernrigg's One Of A Kind,** a win repeated the next day under Jeannine Dowell. On Saturday, John Rowton gave the Group to John & Penny Rogers' Wheaten, **Ch. Cashel's Oban On Ice**, Group 2nd to the Welsh, and Best Baby Puppy to Vicki Stephens' Min. Schnauzer **Empire Takes Berlin**. The Welsh also won the group the last day under Grant Townsend, with Best Baby Puppy going to Debbie Miyashita's Border, **Mysticgold's Chocolat** (aka "Snickers", as in the photo below).

Debbie reports that "Fernrigg Border Terriers had a wonderful time at the recent Renaissance shows and BCATC Specialty in Chilliwack. I took two baby puppies for their first time out and watched in amazement as these two girls gained daily in confidence and showmanship! We won Best Baby Puppy in Group in 3 of the 6 shows on the weekend (Terrier Breeders of Canada didn't have a baby puppy category so really 3 out of 5).

"In addition, I have started selling Ruff Tough Kennels and had a lot of interest in the show, selling four crates and getting orders for more.
