Schnauzer, Group 4th to the Norwich, **Ch. Amblegreen Dralion Inverlochy Dark Storm**, owned by Heather Tomlins and Trudie Forbes, Best Puppy to Karen Doyle's American Staffordshire, **Ch. Chargers Gazella Sweet Dreams,** and Best Baby Puppy to the male Scottie **Glenfraser's Skye Ryder,** owned by Maggie McIlwaine and Barry Truax. Later that day, Dainard took the Scottie on to **Best Baby Puppy in Show**!



On Saturday, Nichols gave Group 2nd to the Min. Schnauzer, Group 3rd and Best Puppy to the American Staffordshire, and Best Baby Puppy to the Scottie who went on again to **Best Baby Puppy in Show** under Stewart Dankner. On Sunday, Taylor gave Group 2nd and Best Puppy to the Wheaten, Group 4th to the Staffordshire Bull Terrier, **Ch. Qwik N Thik The Perfect Alibi @ Rustik**, owned by Sara McDonald and Kelly Thorburn, and Best Baby Puppy to the female littermate Scottie, **Glenfraser's Skye Rose**, owned by Darlene Lenfesty and Barry Truax.

The Elsie Murray Canine Centre Society held their November shows at Heritage Park in Chilliwack on Nov. 12-14 with Terriers being judged by Hal Pybus of BC, Dr. Antonio Molino of Mexico, and Kim Leblanc from Ontario. On Friday, Pybus gave Group 4th to Vicki & Greg Stephens' Min. Schnauzer, **GChB. Empire Dreamaker Hot Tip**, and Best Puppy to Judy Hodgkins' Wheaten, **Hion Come As You Are**, with Kim Leblanc taking her on to **Best Puppy in Show** later that day. Best Baby Puppy in Group went to Vicki & Greg Stephens' Min. Schnauzer, **Empire's Stargate To The Moon**. On Saturday, Dr. Ortiz gave Group 2nd to Larisa Hotchin's Welsh, **Ch. Darwyn's Notorious** and Group 3rd and Best Puppy in Group to the Wheaten. Best Baby Puppy also went to the Min. Schnauzer, who Hal Pybus later took on to **Best Baby Puppy in Show**. On Sunday, Leblanc gave Group 3rd and Best Puppy to the Wheaten and Best Baby Puppy to another Wheaten, **Von Waren Check Me Out At Argona & Skyfall**.

The final shows of the 2021 year in BC were held jointly by the Nanaimo and Tyee Kennel Clubs in what they called the Winter Classic, a set of shows in Duncan Dec. 2-5. Terriers were judged by Honey Glendinning, Tom & Sandy Alexander, and Richard Lopaschuk. The first day, Glendinning gave Group 3rd and Best Puppy to Judy Hodgkins' Wheaten, **Hion Come As You Are.** On Saturday, Alexander's puppy choice was also the Wheaten, with Best Veteran in Group going to Caren Holtby's Australian, **Can/Am GCh. Tidewalker's Diamond Glory.** On Saturday, Lopaschuk did the same for the Wheaten and Australian. On Sunday, Sandy Alexander gave Group 3rd to the Australian, **Ch. Tidewalker Epsilon Grace**, owned by Caren Holtby, Alan Hannebauer and Karen McColm, plus Group 4th and Best Puppy to the Wheaten and Best Veteran to the Australian.

The 2022 show year in BC began, as is traditional, with Ladies K.C. holding 3 shows at Heritage Park in Chilliwack. Terriers were judged by Thora Brown from Ontario, Sharon Derrick from Alberta and Wayne Thompson filling in for Dianne Miller from Ontario. On Friday, Brown gave Group 2nd to Vicki & Greg Stephens' Min. Schnauzer, **GChB. Empire Dreamaker Hot Tip,** and Best Puppy in Group to the Scottie **Glenfraser's Skye Ryder,** owned by Maggie McIlwaine and Barry Truax. On Saturday, Thompson gave Group 4th to the Min. Schnauzer, and on Sunday, Derrick gave Group 4th to Larisa Hotchin's Welsh, **Ch. Darwyn's Notorious.**

The next weekend, March 4-6, the Victoria City K.C. held three shows in Duncan, with Terriers being judged by Michael Woods and Lee Steeves from Nova Scotia, and Mike Jackman from Ontario, with 40-50 terriers being entered. Woods did not place any club members' dogs, but on Saturday, Steeves gave Group 4th to Vicki & Greg Stephens' Min. Schnauzer, **GChB. Empire Dreamaker Hot Tip** and Best Bred by Exhibitor in Group to the Australian, **Ch. Tidewalker Epsilon Grace**, owned by Caren Holtby, Alan Hannebauer and Karen McColm. The last day, in a striking upset, Jackman gave Group 2nd, Best Puppy and Best Owner Handled to a 7-month old Norwich puppy, **Amblegreen Den-Mar's All In,** owned by Cyndy Monk, Marie Cato and Heather Tomlins, handled by Cyndy (see photo p. 6). Group 3rd went to the Min. Schnauzer.

Another week later, Mr. Cheam Canine Assoc. held 4 days of shows in Chilliwack March 10-13, including a "UK Breeds theme show", and drew a huge entry of Terriers, worthy of a Specialty, in the range of 60-80 dogs. Susan Norris-Jones judged the limited entry show on Thursday, in a group of less than 20 dogs, and awarded the Group to Judy Hodgkins' new Wheaten puppy, **Hion Chasing Justice**, and took it on to **Best Puppy in Show**. Group 2nd went to Larisa Hotchin's Welsh, **Ch. Darwyn's Notorious**, and Group 4th to Joy Viel's Irish puppy, **Red Branch N Justnjoyits Perfection In Bronze.** Terrier breeder Dianne Ivey awarded "Best in Limited Breeds Show" to the Wheaten. In the 3 larger all-breed shows, perhaps because of the absence of David & Pat Gignac from the ring, it was open season for owner handlers and promising puppies, with very tough competition among the 17-19 terrier breeds being shown, but overall Larisa Hotchin's Welsh Terriers had the best weekend. On Friday, Dianne Ivey awarded the group to the Wheaten puppy, Group 2nd to Larisa Hotchin's Welsh, **Ch. Darwyn's Notorious**, Group 3rd to the Irish puppy, and Best Baby Puppy in Group to Larisa Hotchin's Welsh, **Salient Darwyn I Am The One**, which was taken on to **Best Baby Puppy in Show** by Murray Eason.

On Saturday, Rosemary Shoreman judged Terriers and awarded the Group to Larisa Hotchin's Welsh, Ch. Darwyn's Notorious, taking it on to Reserve Best in Show and Best Bred By Exhibitor in Show. Group 4th went to the Australian, Ch. Tidewalker Epsilon Grace, owned by Caren Holtby, Alan Hannebauer and Karen McColm. This dog paired up with Best Veteran, Caren Holtby's Australian, Can/Am GCh. Tidewalker's Diamond Glory, to win Best Brace in Group. On Sunday, Raymond Lariviere from Quebec judged another large group of Terriers, and awarded the Group to the Welsh, Ch. Darwyn's Notorious – and took it on to Best In Show – and also took Larisa's Baby Puppy, Salient Darwyn I Am The One, on to Best Baby Puppy In Show. This was an exciting and well deserved milestone for Larisa, who has had BIS wins previously (with her male, Joey) using professional handlers, but this was a first for her – back to back RBIS and BIS – where she was in the ring. Congratulations!
