BCATC SPECIALTY SHOW 2019

The club's annual Specialty show will be held **Saturday, October 12**, in conjunction with the Fraser Valley Dog Fanciers shows which will be held at the **Heritage Centre** in Chilliwack in conjunction with four all-breed shows, and a Limited Group show on Sunday, so **6** sets of points. The noted terrier judge **Shawn Watson** from Cyprus will judge all breeds and the Group. The Puppy, Juvenile & Veteran Sweeps judge will be **David Denis**.

There will be an all-terrier Obedience Trial on Friday, judged by **Christopher Cornell** from Washington state, and in the all-breed Rally Trial, a prize will be offered to the highest qualifying terrier. Consult the premium list for the specific prizes offered.

Junior handling for all terriers is also being planned for Saturday, following conformation. A Scottish Terrier Regional Specialty will be held on Sunday, judged by **John Wade** from Nevada, with Juvenile Sweeps judged by **Cynthia Seeling**.

Prizes and rosettes will be awarded to the Group placing winners (for other breed prizes consult the premium list). Best in Specialty and Best Puppy will receive a limited edition signed print by Nancy Popovich. Supported entries for Borders, Min. Schnauzers, Norwich, Sealyham, Wheatens and Westies, sponsored by a number of club members, along with Boosters for Cairns and Scotties. Non-regular classes for Baby Puppy, Brace, Stud Dog and Brood Bitch will also be offered.

The show chair is Margaret Jones, and the show secretary is Classic Show Services whose webpage contains complete information: classicshowservices.ca

It is with great sadness that we announce the passing of club Life Member, Evelyn C. Smith (1929-2019) at the age of 90 on July 4 following a short illness. Evelyn passed away peacefully at the Saanich Peninsula Hospital ECU with her daughter by her side.

Predeceased by her husband Jim in 2007, sister Mary and brother Fred (Sharyn), Evelyn is survived by her daughter Kathryn, brother Jack (Reina), nieces and nephews.

Evelyn was born in Victoria and remained in the city all of her life. She married Jim in 1951 and shortly after, they built their house in Gordon Head, where she lived for over 60 years.

Evelyn enjoyed gardening, reading, music and traveling around BC with Jim in their RV. She also loved photography, and was a member and President of the Victoria Pentax Club for many years. In later years, her Norwich Terriers also obtained their obedience and show titles. Agility trials also became a huge part of her life.

Evelyn inspired all who knew her with her strength and determination, along with her kindness and big heart. She will be greatly missed by all those who loved her.

The judge was terrier specialist Sylvia Barkey from Ontario. Her new male puppy imported from Russia ("Tzar") aka **Brait Nouz Glad to Be With You** also did very well. He won BOW & BPISS. Tzar is co-owned by Kelly and Linda Carmichael. She was thrilled with these wins!



“Halo,” **Ch. Mysticgold's Broken Halo**, also finished her championship by going BOW at the Pacific Show in July. After only 2 weekends of showing “Timmy,” **Ch. Mysticgold's Play It Again**, finished his championship at the AKC Show held at Spruce Meadows, Calgary, Alberta in early August.

Heather Tomlins reports that **Amblegreen Dralion Mr Bean** earned his Championship at the Victoria Kennel Club show. He is co-bred by Kelly Wood, Linda Dowdle and Heather Tomlins. He is pictured below with judge Margaret Jones and his handler, Celeste Bennett, after winning at the RRTA Specialty on August 17: Best of Breed, Best Veteran in Specialty and a Group 2nd.

On Sunday, August 18th, under judge Richard Reynolds in the BTC National Specialty, Keeper was Best Veteran, Select Dog, and with **GCh. Otterwise Bentley at Benchmark** (son Bentley) was Best Brace.

On Thursday and Friday, August 15 and 16th, Keeper took Best of Breed at both MCA shows, plus a Group 3 under Judge Pat Taylor. On Thursday, Bentley and Gracie (**Can GCh. Am Ch. Zealous My Best to You**) joined Keeper in the line-up as Select Dog and Select Bitch, respectively.

The next day Philip John, from India, also awarded the Group to the Scottie ("Leidi"). The last day, the Mexican judge Jorge Luis Patino Fernandez awarded the Group to the Welsh.

At the Prince George shows, July 26-28 (two shows/day), Ilean Danby's Cairn Terrier, **GCh. Iz's Red Moon Rising**, went Group 4th under Lee Anne Bateman, and her Veteran Cairn, **GCh. Grayfriar's Max CGN RA**, went Best Veteran in Show under the same judge, and Best Veteran in Group under Janet Lobb and Mel Saranchuk.

The second day Sue-Ellen Rempel gave Best Owner Handled in Group to Vicki & Greg Stephens' Min. Schnauzer, **GCh. Empire Dreamaker Hot Tip**. The last day, Elizardo Valadez gave Best Puppy to the Min. Schnauzer, and Best Baby Puppy to the Norwich.

At the Glacier View shows in Courtenay, August 6-8, John & Penny Rogers' Veteran Wheaten **GCh. Cashel's Oban On Ice**, went Group 2nd under John Rowton who gave Best Baby Puppy to Heather Tomlins' Norwich, **Amblegreen Dralion Wild Style**.
