

TOP TERRIERS FOR 2020

Despite the very limited number of shows and trials in 2020 because of the pandemic lockdowns, particularly in BC, the CKC compiled its annual Top Dogs lists for 2020 and sent out certificates. However, the BCATC executive decided not to host an awards event this year, or to hold a Specialty, given the many issues around organizing such an event. According to *Canuckdogs.com* lists of Top Dog standings for 2020, our member dogs' standings are as follows in conformation, with none listed for Obedience and Rally Obedience.

As shown here, **GCh. Empire Dreamaker Hot Tip ("Chase")** owned by Vicki & Greg Stephens, despite the limited number of shows in 2020, won 10 Group placements and 158 points, making him #9 Terrier in Canada and #1 Min. Schnauzer, as recognized by the CKC. Chase is also the first Min. Schnauzer to achieve a Bronze Grand Championship title.



The third day, Graham awarded Group 3rd and Best Puppy to the Cairn. The last day, Glendinning awarded Group 4th and Best Puppy to the Soft-Coated Wheaten, **Greentree Lady O'Cashel**, owned by John & Penny Rogers.

The first show of the year on the Mainland was held by Mt. Cheam Canine Assoc. at the Thunderbird Equestrian centre in Langley, July 16-18, with David Gilmour, Judy Shurb and Richard Paquette judging Terriers. Empire Dreamaker Hot Tip, Group 3rd to the Welsh Specials, and Best Puppy to the Welsh Puppy. The last day, Paquette awarded the Group to Sara McDonald's Staffie Bull, GCh. Qwik N Thik Dig A Little Deeper, Group 2nd to the Welsh Specials, Group 3rd to the Min. Schnauzer, and Group 4th to Judy Hodgkins' Soft-Coated Wheaten, Hion Come As You Are, with Best Puppy going to the Welsh puppy, thereby completing a "club sweep" of group placements.

The Glacier View show in Courtney followed Aug. 2-4 with terriers being judged by Judy McVeigh, Susan Quesnel and Bruce Fraser. Fraser gave the Min. 
