#### SHOW WINS

Janis Trotzuk reports: It was a hot weekend at the Vernon & District KC show July 4-7, with all doing their best to stay cool, dogs and humans alike. Trotters Scotties did quite well. **GCh. Trotters Butterscotch Miss** ("Cindy") earned two Group 2<sup>nd</sup> wins under judges Alex Rojas and Judy McVeigh (BCATC booster). Also a big win, a Group 1<sup>st</sup> at the Limited Terrier Show under breeder judge Ernesto Lara. Cindy was presented to all by Jolie McMullan. Last year **GChB. Trotters Shadee Lady** ("Pearl") took the spotlight going **Best in Show**, with **GCh. Pendor Rendezvous At Trotters** ("Ronnie") winning Best Puppy in Group. Thank you to the Vernon and District Kennel club.

Our President, Debbie Miyashita put together the usual booster for the Vernon & District KC show. She reports: As I was also doing judges (and committee and photographer and Show Secretary) lunches for 20 people each day and Jim and I did the cooking for the Hawaiian BBQ Saturday night, I decided to put it on Sunday with Judy McVeigh (Judge Judy) rather than Saturday with Ernesto Lara. There were 34 terriers entered and I purchased and provided Tim Horton's gift cards - Group 1 - \$50, Group 2 - \$40, Group 3 - \$30 and Group 4 - \$25 plus BPIG - \$25. I purchased an extra \$25 for a possible BBPIG but there were none so I'll take that off the bill and keep the card - actually I gave it to Jim for all his work cooking Saturday night and he was pleased - but it comes off the BCATC invoice. I ordered and put out a cooler of cold water and Gatorade to help people stay hydrated in the heat! Group 4 started at 8:00 a.m. and was finished, I believe, by about 9:30.

Sara McDonald (Rustik Staffordshire Bulls) reports that her "Mint", Am. Ch. GCh. Rustik's It's Only Money Honey with Qwik N Thik SDIN, has been a busy girl, earning her American championship in May at the Lynden WA shows. She finished in style going BOS and BOB from the classes in a large number of Staffords on both days. Then we attended her US first show in Graham WA as a special, and she went Select for a 5 point major at the Stafford regional specialty under breeder judge Katherine Holmen.

Then a group  $3^{rd}$  under Ernesto Lara in the Group 4 limited breed show in tough terrier lineup. Mint is the #1 Stafford bitch in Canada and also being in the top 5 and she has maintained these spots for the majority of year. Mint is just a few points shy of her grand championship bronze which we hope to finish soon.

The Staffords are not a super popular breed in conformation, so any big placements and titles are a huge honour to earn and I am so proud of my bred by redhead! We have a new up n coming bred by at Rustik, Smitty, and we are hopeful he will follow in the footsteps of Mint and become a fabulous breed ambassador.

Ken & Elaine Allen (Dreamaker Miniature Schnauzers) are very proud breeder/owners of two young special show girls **Ch. Dreamaker Talk Of The Town** (Rumor) and her littermate Bliss. Rumor competed her Championship at the Glacier View Kennel Club show in August and is now in pursuit of her last single point to complete her US Championship. Their **GCh. Dreamaker Red Danger Zone** (Berlyn) completed her Championship in 2023 and then her US title in January 2024 under judge Peggy Beisel McIlwaine with a 5-point major.



Their **Can/Am Ch. Dreamaker Leap Of Faith** (Aura), co-bred and co-owned with Krystal Mason, finished her US championship at the Clackamas Kennel Club Terrier Association of Oregon Specialty, winning her fourth major in June 2024 under Dr. Robert W.T. Myall going BOW, Gr 1<sup>st</sup> Bred by Exhibitor, & Group 4<sup>th</sup> Owner Handled. Our heartfelt thanks to all the judges who awarded Aura, and in particular judges John C. Ramirez, Jon R. Cole and Peggy Beisel-McIlwaine who also awarded her major wins! Aura was exclusively Owner Handled by Ken Allen from the Bred by Exhibitor class to her US & Can Championships. Aura is their **50<sup>th</sup> American Champion**, and a granddaughter of their much loved "Faith" (**Can GCh. Am GChS. Dreamaker Blue Angels**).
